North Carolina Museum of Art Hosts Free Art Event for Teens
ArtScene features live entertainment, art workshops, and teen art on view

Raleigh, N.C.—On April 25, 2015, the North Carolina Museum of Art (NCMA) hosts [ArtScene](#), an annual free event for teens across North Carolina. Centered on the theme of “Work in Progress,” the event features art-making workshops, live music and dance performances, a pop-up teen art gallery, and food. Participants will have the opportunity to meet local artists and participate in a variety of scenes exploring the artistic process. The event concludes with an award ceremony and reception celebrating winners of this year's [Teens, Inspired](#) art competition.

ArtScene is organized by the NCMA Teen Arts Council, a group of 25 teens from area North Carolina high schools.

ArtScene features several Museum “scenes,” including:

- **Live Scene:** Enjoy music and dance performances by the Enloe Dance Troupe, Look a Ghost, Qualian, The Motions, Jill’s Socks, and more.
- **Artists’ Row:** Chat with local artists and observe their processes in action. Artists include Caroline Cockrell, Susan Soper, Kate Faulkner, Sharon Bass, Brenda Brokke, and Leatha Koeffler.
- **Group Print:** Drop in and work on a collaborative blueprint-inspired drawing.
- **50/50:** Sign up to be the subject of one of NCMA artist-in-residence Kiki Farish’s 50-second portraits.
- **Green Scene:** Make art outdoors and take a stroll through the Museum Park (weather permitting).
- **Teens, Inspired Pop-Up Gallery:** Check out the accepted poems and 2-D works of art, and vote for your favorite.
- **Film Scene:** Watch screenings of *Teens, Inspired* videos.
- **Blueprint Photo Booth:** Draw your own backdrop for a selfie.
- **Work in Progress Student Exhibition:** See student work in progress from three of the Museum’s [online high school courses](#) (available through North Carolina Virtual Public School).
