North Carolina Museum of Art Foundation Announces Viking River Cruise Raffle
All proceeds from raffle to support Museum exhibitions and programming

Raleigh, N.C.—This fall the North Carolina Museum of Art Foundation presents a raffle to win a Viking River Cruises Rhine Getaway Christmas Market Cruise for two, which features an eight-day trip along the Rhine River from Amsterdam, Netherlands, to Basel, Switzerland. One thousand five hundred raffle tickets will be sold for \$100 each. All proceeds will support Museum exhibitions and programming.

The prize package includes:

- Round-trip airfare: Raleigh–Amsterdam and Basel–Raleigh
- Airport transfers to hotel and ship
- Two nights in the five-star Amsterdam Conservatorium Hotel
- Eight-day cruise in a stateroom with a river-view veranda
- Six guided tours with audio headset
- All meals on board the cruise ship: seven breakfasts, six lunches, seven dinners
- Complimentary wine and beer with onboard dinner and lunch service
- Sail through four countries: the Netherlands, Germany, France, and Switzerland

The prize also includes payment on the winner’s behalf of the tax withholdings required by federal law.

Raffle tickets will go on sale October 9, 2014. Sales will end December 21, 2014, or when tickets are sold out. The raffle winner will be notified by December 31, 2014.
