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North Carolina Museum of Art Announces Related Events for Fall Exhibition Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary

Raleigh, N.C.— The North Carolina Museum of Art (NCMA) announces its fall 2021 events related to special exhibition *Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary*, opening October 23, 2021, including member events, lectures, tours, educator events, and more.

Czech-born Alphonse Mucha (1860–1939) was one of the most celebrated artists in Paris at the turn of the 20th century. As an influential force behind the art nouveau movement, he created sumptuous posters and advertising materials—promoting such everyday products as cigarette papers and tea biscuits—that transformed the streets of Paris into open-air art exhibitions.

Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary celebrates the Mucha Trust Collection's first major U.S. tour in 20 years, featuring a vast array of posters, illustrations, ornamental objects, and rarely seen sculpture, photography, and self-portraits—all showcasing Mucha's distinctive style of harmonious compositions, sinuous forms, organic motifs, and lush color palettes. Additional works from the NCMA's collection highlight Mucha's influence in America and his close friendship with French sculptor Auguste Rodin.

In addition to related events, the Museum's East Café will feature Parisian-inspired dishes, signature cocktails, and decadent desserts, and the Museum Store will stock an exclusive exhibition catalogue featuring essays by cocurators Tomoko Sato of the Mucha Foundation and Michele Frederick, associate curator of European art at the NCMA. Related



products including books, magnets, scarves, and more will be sold. The Museum has partnered with Spoonflower to offer cocktail napkins and decorative pillowcases featuring an exclusive art nouveau pattern inspired by the flowers in the Museum Park.

Culinary Adventure: Alphonse Mucha

Join us for a tour of Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau

Visionary followed by an evening of culinary treasures. A champagne and canape cocktail hour precedes a multicourse dinner and wine pairing. This gastronomic journey, inspired by the organic forms and exquisite motifs of Mucha's art, features both rustic French fare and sophisticated Parisian delights.

Live from the Studio: Colored Pencils with Shelby Scattergood

The influence of the iconic patterned and stylized portraiture of Alphonse Mucha, as exhibited in *Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary*, is reflected in the highly detailed work of North Carolina artist Shelby Scattergood. Join Scattergood virtually in her studio for this 90-minute demo class in which she discusses her art and introduces basic colored-pencil drawing techniques. Participants explore pencil strokes, blending, highlighting, and shadow, and join everything together by learning how to draw a water droplet.

<u>Virtual Lunchtime Lecture: In Quest of Beauty: The Evolution of Mucha's Visual</u> Language

Join Mucha Foundation curator Tomoko Sato virtually as she discusses the exhibition *Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary*. This lecture focuses on the theoretical aspect of Mucha's work, especially his idea of beauty—the core principle of his art—and looks at how the Mucha style evolved from his Parisian posters to an artistic language to express his political and philosophical message after his return to his native Czech lands.

Lunchtime Lecture: NCMA Artists in Mucha's Time

Join Michele Frederick, associate curator of European art, to learn about works from the NCMA collection in the exhibition *Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary*. First she examines the international scope of the artistic practices and developments that influenced Mucha through two paintings by American artists who studied in France and then brought new kinds of art back to the United States around the turn of the twentieth century. Then Frederick explores Mucha's and Auguste Rodin's lasting friendship and how new scientific and aesthetic developments influenced Rodin's transformation of sculpture into modern art.

Studio Workshop: Art Nouveau Block-Print Pattern Design

Using the art nouveau style of Alphonse Mucha as inspiration, we design small block prints that can be used to create repeating patterns or an elegant stand-alone image.

Mindful Museum: Virtual Slow-Art Appreciation: Alphonse Mucha

Slow art is a growing movement to mindfully observe and communally appreciate art. During this special session in conjunction with the exhibition *Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary*, participate in a brief centering practice followed by an intentional observation of an artwork by Mucha. Sharing and discussion are encouraged. This is a great practice to calm the mind and experience art in a deeper way.

Virtual Studio Workshop: Nouveau Fashion Illustration with Jillian Ohl

The work of Alphonse Mucha is immediately recognizable in its use of elegant motifs, which are still seen in fashion and advertising today. In this workshop participants explore Mucha's art nouveau masterpieces and learn how they relate to contemporary fashion illustration. The instructor also teaches some basics of fashion illustration, drawing, and pattern design.


