North Carolina Museum of Art to Host North Carolina Premiere of *Overland* Documentary

Weekend of programming planned to celebrate global connections through falconry

Raleigh, N.C.—The North Carolina Museum of Art (NCMA) announces a special outdoor showing of the documentary *Overland*, directed by North Carolina-based filmmakers Revere La Noue and Elisabeth Haviland James, with a weekend of related programming, including a self-guided scavenger hunt, indoor family matinee screening, and two bird walks with a park ranger. Join us for the N.C. premiere of *Overland*, a stunning, stirring cinematic journey about three falconers shot across four continents. How can we connect to our natural, primal spirit when modern society threatens to erase it? The film *Overland* twists and turns like nature itself, bridging ancient to modern, east to west, and earth to sky. It follows the stories of



three falconers, "Jedi Knights of Nature," each facing a unique set of challenges as they pursue their passion for the ancient art of partnering with birds of prey.

Lauren, a daredevil anthropologist from Oklahoma, trains injured eagles to fly and hunt while scouring the world for age-old falconry secrets. Giovanni has fled a troubled childhood in Rome for a solitary life in the Italian countryside with his wolves, hawks, and horse. In Dubai Khalifa is training to be the world's best falcon racer. As each of these stories unfolds, eagles, hawks, and falcons play a critical role in helping their human partners keep the wild from fading out of sight and out of mind.
